Community & Partnerships Executive Member briefing – June 2024

Community & Licensing

Community Safety

- Community Safety have participated in two Operation Outing multi agency checks, one on the A10 at Royston and one on the A505 at Lilley. Police, Customs, Trading Standards and North Herts Council were in attendance, examining vehicles for potential offences. Some minor waste transfer offences identified, and warnings/advice issued.
- A Violence Against Women and Girls (VAWG) event was held at the DCO. It was aimed at secondary school management and included guest speakers warning about the Incel movement and the dangers of 'sexting' pornography and by schoolchildren. All secondary schools in North Herts attended, as well as SEN (special education needs head teachers) and was very well received. North Herts Community Safety partnership have secured £5k funding from the OPCC to allow schools to survey their pupils to see how widespread the issues are.
- A promotional event was held in Hitchin Market Place to educate the public on 'Cuckooing' and included a large Ad Van with a billboard to explain the issues. Police and North Herts Council attended and despite the poor weather there was a good interaction with the public.
- There is currently an Anti-Social behaviour case review under investigation for an address in Ickleford, which is a long-standing neighbour dispute.

Democratic Services

Committee Services

- Induction Sessions have taken place since the May 2024 election with new and re-elected Members attending sessions covering topics including, scrutiny, planning and licensing. These sessions have been well attended by Members.
- Preparing ahead of the first round of meetings in June and July and have had to re-schedule some meetings to accommodate the election on 4 July.
- Scrutiny Officer has been working on documents and processes, alongside the new Chair and Vice Chair, on how the scrutiny function can be improved at the Council.
- Notified Outside Organisations of their appointed Members following Annual Council.

- Updating ModGov with Committee membership and specific roles following Annual Council.
- Supporting a work placement for a student from Bournemouth University, who is shadowing Committee Services over June.

Electoral Services

- General election has been called for 4 July – preparations are well underway.
- Polling station bookings have all been finalised and staffing arrangements starting to take place.
- We are implanting our cross-boundary arrangements with the teams at East Herts, Central Bedfordshire and Stevenage with whom we work on cross boundary constituencies now following the latest boundary review.
- Poll cards have been despatched and other printing arrangements for postal votes and ballot papers have been confirmed.
- The team have also been dealing with the related surge in registration applications, postal vote applications and other registration-based queries.

- Successful support of co-hosted 'All About Us' conference in May with LGCHF and NHCVS.

- Ongoing updates on the Climate Hive Engagement page – Hive updates for Hitchin Eco-day, Water Saving week VCSE Energy Efficiency Scheme,

World Environment Day and On Demand bus services.

- Council Plan workshop preparation for new administration.

- AGS compiling assurance statements, action plan development, and finishing draft condensed version AGS for June FAR meeting.

- 2.2 That Cabinet expresses its profound disappointment at the position taken by Centrica over the cost of the CHP contract termination, given the company's stated position as "Energising a greener, fairer future" and requests that the Council continues to raise, and seek solutions to, the issue of long-term inflexible agreements for gas CHPs with Salix and Government, which will inevitably prevent many public sector organisations from achieving their net zero ambitions.
- 2.3 That Cabinet does not approve the business case for Royston Leisure Centre Learner Pool and the capital budget is removed from the capital programme, due to the matters identified in the Part 2 report.

That Cabinet recommends to Council:

- 2.4 An increase in capital expenditure of £2.4m into the capital programme for the decarbonisation work to the three leisure centres. The overall budget will be profiled across 2024/25 and 2025/26.
- 2.5 An increase in the capital budget of £250k for the Royston Leisure Centre (RLC) gym extension, to ensure the extension is built to net zero carbon standards.
- 2.6 Approval of revenue expenditure of up to £757k for termination and removal fees of the gas CHPs at North Herts Leisure Centre and Hitchin Fitness and Swimming Centre. This would be funded from General Fund reserves.

REASONS FOR RECOMMENDATIONS:

- (1) North Herts Council passed a climate emergency motion in May 2019. This declaration asserted the council's commitment toward climate action beyond current government targets and international agreements. This is currently pursued through the North Herts Climate Change Strategy 2022-2027 which sets out what the council will aim to do to reduce its own carbon emissions to achieve Carbon Neutrality for the Council's own operations by 2030 and a Net Zero Carbon district by 2040.
- (2) Gas use from our leisure centres is a significant contributor towards the Council's own emissions. In 2022-23, gas use across the three leisure centres accounted for 1,428 tonnes CO2e. This equates to 45% of the Council's Scope 1-3 emissions. Taking action to replace gas heating for our leisure centres with low carbon alternatives is the single most effective action we can take towards meeting our target of being carbon neutral by 2030.
- (3) There is currently a capital allocation in the 2024/25 budget to build a gym extension and learner pool (subject to business case) at Royston Leisure Centre.
- (4) During the procurement for the leisure and active communities contract, the Council committed to deliver the gym extension project which is incorporated in to the contractual management fee. The initial tender stage returns showed that extension would generate additional income of at least £150k per year, and subject to inflationary increases. The latest estimate is that the capital costs will be £1.25m. This is an increase from the initial estimate of £1m and includes making the extension net-zero. The income generated will still exceed the revenue cost of capital (at around £90k per year), but in line with the financial regulation the increased capital spend needs to be approved by Cabinet.
- (5) The business case for the learner pool has not yet been agreed and is included in the Part 2 report.
