
Grazing and management

The river is one of a small few that have not been overly managed in modern times by deepening, straightening or de-silting. Purwell Meadows has been grazed by livestock for many years. Grazing has kept and continues to keep the meadows open, the growth of trees and shrubs in check and allows wildflowers and other wetland wildlife to thrive.

Periodically scrub is cleared from the meadows to control its spread. The river will continue to be left to flow a natural course, with only minor bank repairs carried out as required.



How to get there



By Road: Purwell Meadows is located to the east of the town centre of Hitchin. The meadows can be access from the main A505 Cambridge Road and from Purwell Lane, Willian Road and Chaucer Way.
