SUMMARY COMPARISON OF COMMUNITY FACILITIES IN HITCHIN

As part of the investigation into the future use of Hitchin Town Hall, a desk top analysis was undertaken to establish the extent and nature of the community facilities within Hitchin, provided by a variety of private, public and voluntary sector sources, and to gain a view on level of usage of those facilities.

This analysis took the form of an audit of thirty five (35) community centres, halls, church halls, schools etc, all located within a 3000m radius of the Town Hall itself. Each facility was contacted and information gathered on its size, capacity, availability for hire, current hire groups, and where possible, an estimate of its current level of usage determined.

From the information obtained, the facilities were graded into four bands depending on the nature and extent of availability for use by the general public.

Hitchin Town Hall was graded as an A1, with others graded from A2 to D1 to reflect the nature and extent of the respective hire options / facilities available

The number of facilities and their relative grading descriptions are shown below.

A 1	-	Hitchin Town Hall	1
A 2	-	Urban Community Centres	5
B1	-	Less facilities available / capacity for hire than A2	11
C1	-	Less facilities available / capacity for hire than B1	10
D1	-	Specialist / Focussed Hire	8

From the survey, and where it was possible to make an assessment, it was estimated that the overall usage operating capacity of the facilities was 70 %.

A list of the facilities surveyed is attached as is a diagram showing their locations, in relation to Hitchin Town Hall.

HITCHIN TOWN HALL BRIEF HISTORY & BACKGROUND

Hitchin Town Hall was built around 1901. It is situated in Brand Street, in the town centre. The accommodation is arranged on three floors and basement, offering a flexibility of space to provide for a wide range of activities taking place at the same time such as dance/music, sports general meetings. It is an ideal venue to hold a variety of private, public and celebratory functions including wedding receptions, christenings, barmitsvahs, birthday parties, business meetings, conferences, seminars, training programmes, product launches and club meetings.

The Town Hall is the largest hall in terms of size and capacity in Hitchin (holding up to 800 persons) It provides for 30,000 persons living within a two mile radius as well as users from other parts of North Hertfordshire. Its nearest competitor is generally regarded as the Gordon Craig Theatre in Stevenage.

The Main hall on the ground floor has a capacity for up to 300 people seated with tables and chairs and 500 people standing. It has a wooden sprung floor and a proscenium stage.

The Gymnasium also on the ground floor and has a capacity for up to 200 people.

The Lucas room on the first floor has a capacity for up to 40 people.

The Bar on the ground floor has a capacity for up to 20 people.

The Upper Hall on the second floor above the gymnasium is currently solely used by St Johns Ambulance.

There are other ancillary spaces in the building including cloak rooms and a storage area on the ground floor, an office, a balcony and changing rooms on the first floor and changing rooms in the basement below the stage. There are also ample toilet facilities including a disabled one.

The accommodation comes with limited parking spaces (four to the side and four to the rear) However, there are a number of public and private car parking spaces spread throughout the town centre that are mostly located within a few minutes walking distance of the Town Hall.

Even though the Main hall and the Gymnasium have disabled access and there is a disabled toilet on the ground floor, the building does not fully comply with the Disability Discrimination Act 1995.

THE COLLECTIONS OF NORTH HERTS MUSEUMS SERVICE

The collections displayed at Hitchin and Letchworth Museums are very different, and these notes aim to explain why this is, and to clarify the differences.

Historically, in their early years both museums collected items of mainly local historical and cultural interest. Letchworth Museum was founded in 1914, and Hitchin in 1941(Hitchin Library opened in 1938). After the foundation of NHDC in 1974 the two museums joined to become North Herts. Museums Service, with a shared Director of Museums. The two natural history collections were amalgamated to form a Natural History Department, and the museums began to specialise, Letchworth in the natural history and archaeology of the district, and Hitchin in local and social history, costume, and the Herts. Yeomanry collections. The Hitchin collections (objects and archives) have always covered many of the villages in the district. After 1974 Letchworth Museum's Schools Service began to provide classes at Hitchin, and the School Loan Service served the district and beyond. Both museums continued to collect and display watercolours and oil paintings. In 1990 Hitchin Museum's natural history display was moved from the museum, and the Chemist's Shop opened in its place.

From 1977 the history of Letchworth Garden City, originally displayed at Letchworth Museum, was shown in a new museum on Norton Way South, in a house which had originally been the drawing office of architects Parker & Unwin. There had been occasional exhibitions here from 1973, but an extension was built and the museum opened informally in 1977, and officially the following year. It was run by NHDC, managed by the Curator of Letchworth Museum with a Local History Assistant in charge. In 1984 the administration was taken over by Letchworth Corporation, now the First Garden City Heritage Foundation, although ownership of the Garden City collections acquired up to that date remains with NHDC. Since then, excluding paintings, Letchworth Museum has not collected items relating to the Garden City.

Material from the collections of both museums which is not on display is stored either on site (mainly delicate items like costume and fine art) or in the museum service store. This has moved around the district, from Baldock to Mrs Howard Hall, to its current site on Burymead Road. This store contains large amounts of social history material from both museums, as well as the archaeology and natural history collections, the Education Loan Collection, and an archive of local newspapers.

In conclusion, Letchworth Museum has very little local or social history on display, and does not function as a 'local' museum in the same way as Hitchin. Most of its local material is already at the Garden City Heritage Museum. If Letchworth Museum closes, its current collections would not be of any interest to the Heritage Museum, as they are not Garden City specific. There is one showcase about the villages of Norton, Willian and Letchworth, and a small display about the Norton Community Archaeology project but these are the only displays directly related to the town. It is fair to say that around 90% of objects on view at Hitchin Museum are directly related to that town, whereas 90% of the permanent displays at Letchworth Museum show material from all over the district, and are not exclusively related to Letchworth.

EXISTING MUSEUM ACCOMMODATION AND PROPOSED USE OF SPACE AT HITCHIN TOWN HALL

The existing museums at Hitchin and Letchworth house a number of different types of accommodation. For the purposes of this feasibility study these have been separated into generic room types.

Using the following definition of types:

- Exhibition display of artefacts (generally in cases)
- Gallery display of artwork (generally two-dimensionally)
- Temporary exhibition for the short term display (gallery or exhibition)

Following analysis of the existing accommodation, the following schedule was produced to provide a comparison with the differing options to be considered.

The Exhibition/Gallery and Temporary exhibition/Flexible use space show a 12.5% increase over the existing provision. However the five fold increase in Community use space also includes significant space to be used for museum service such as the Education Suite and Local History Study centre.
